Personalised learning for young people

Lapwing's Summer Art Group

Led by Lapwing tutor and art specialist, Jane Cannon, the Suffolk based Art Group was set up with the main purpose to bring students together and provide opportunities for them to integrate within a social setting, enjoy therapeutic activities as well as learning new artistic skills. The Art Group follows on from the success of the Media Project carried out in the Autumn Term, where seven students created, edited and produced the "The Mixture Podcast".

The weekly Art Group was attended by 10 students, who were given the opportunity to try out a variety of art activities, from observational drawing and painting, to jewellery making and ceramics. However, the main purpose of the group was to provide a space for students to meet and work together, using art as a relaxing, non-pressured focus. While some students preferred more methodical art activities, such as paint by numbers or mindful colouring, other students really took the opportunity to explore their creative talents. Stevie (pictured), a current Lapwing student who is working towards her Bronze Arts Award, was even able to teach a group of fellow students how to make clay sheep — a real testament to how her confidence has grown during her time at Lapwing.

We were also pleased to welcome back Laura H as a volunteer. Laura graduated from Lapwing in 2020 and is a highly talented artist who achieved her Silver Arts Award before moving on. Laura has been volunteering with us this year, using her artistic talent to teach others while also mentoring Lapwing students as she continues to develop her own skills and transition to adulthood.

A case study on Lapwing recently published by the Thrive Approach, a programme focussing on developing the social and emotional well-being of highlighted how Lapwing's young people, individualised approach "creates meaningful connections between staff and students that helps young people regulate their emotions in a safe, supported way". Lapwing now has three licensed Thrive practitioners, including Lead Tutor, Kerry Lawn, who says "we have now got students feeling good about themselves, and are now able to see a future that they struggled with before".

Minding the Gap – the new Dream Team!

Over the last four months, the Minding the Gap (MTG) project team has seen a total transformation, signing up an unprecedented 60 new participants in quarter 2 and earning the well-deserved nickname of the 'Dream Team' as a result! Led by Project Manager, Claire Flowers, who started working for Lapwing in March, the team has welcomed new keyworkers: Jon Spraggons, Deanna Bentley and Isabelle Malins to work alongside long-term keyworker Carey Jacketts, as well as Claire Cheesman, who provides essential administration support.

Working with 16-24 year-olds who are not in employment, education or training (NEET), Minding the Gap provides support in job searching, careers guidance and or accessing further education. The MTG team also run regular hubs and workshops on everything from managing an allotment, arts and crafts, budgeting, orienteering, first aid, interview skills, sector specific vocational taster sessions and much much more. This project is enabling participants to proactively engage in their future, work both 1:1 with keyworkers and in groups, while developing meaningful skills for employment and adulthood.
